

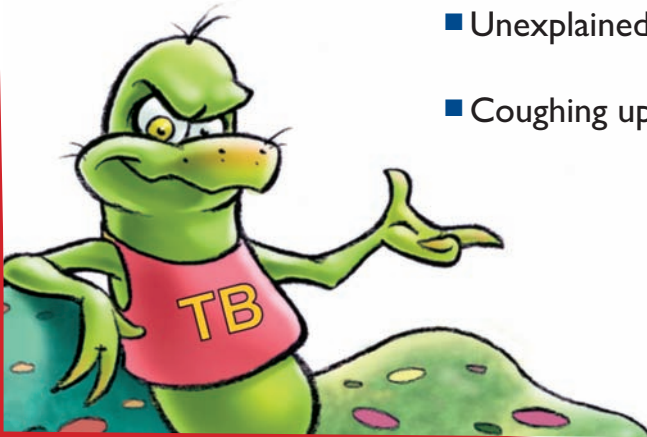


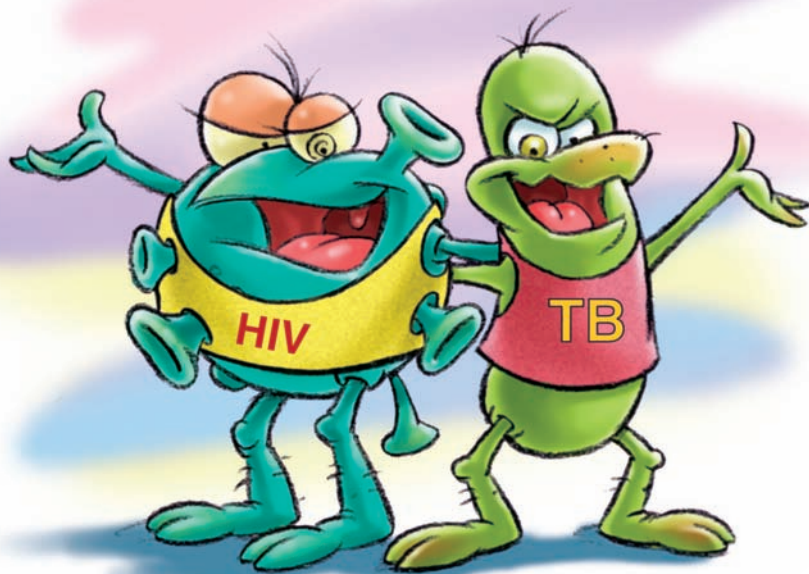
**Why should you worry about
TUBERCULOSIS?**



The main symptoms of TB are:

- Cough for several days
- Fevers
- Night sweats
- Unexplained weight loss
- Coughing up blood

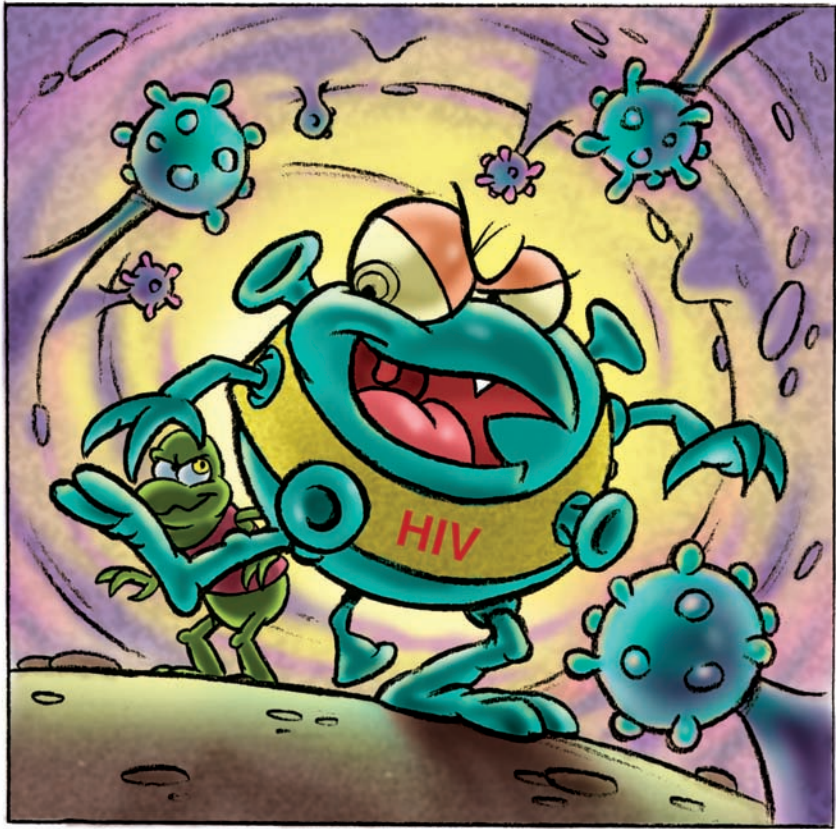




TB is the most common disease in people living with HIV.



TB is the #1 killer of people living with HIV.



It is harder to find TB in HIV-positive people.



What can you do to stop TB?

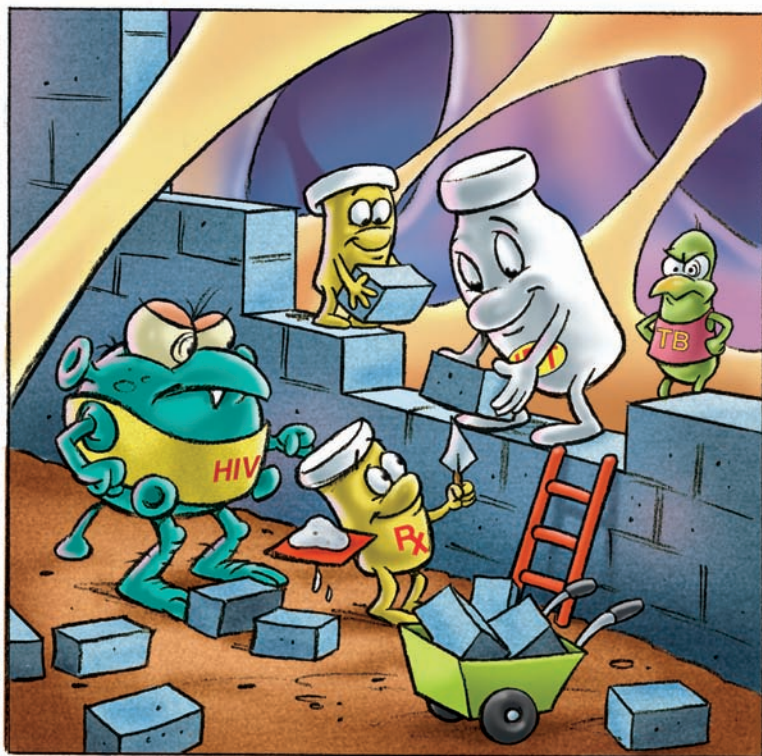
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The earlier you know if you have TB, the better.
If you have HIV, get tested for TB.



Isoniazid preventive therapy (IPT) can prevent TB disease. If you have HIV ask about IPT.



TB drugs can be taken with HIV drugs. If you have HIV and TB take all your medications.
